“Vincent Arslanian, 92, of Independence, MO, passed away Thursday, April 17, 2014. Vincent was born December 9, 1921 in Detroit, MI, the only son of Harabet and Arax (Tetezian) Arslanian. He attended the University of Detroit before enlisting in the Army. Vincent was a U.S. Army Veteran of WWII serving in France and the Philippines. After the war Vincent returned to the University of Detroit where he received his Chemical Engineering Degree. He worked at various companies in Detroit, Syracuse, Kansas City, and Minneapolis as project supervisor packaging specialist before retiring in 1988 from the U.S. Department of the Army. Vincent and his wife moved to Kansas City to be near family in 1989. He later went back to work for the EPA as environmental engineer, retiring in 2004.
