 them and their Heirs forever but in case the said Ann Collins should
 die without Issue I give and Bequeath the said slaves to my Grand
 Daughter Marget Collins her Heirs and assigns forever
 I give and Bequeath to my Grand Daughter Ann Collins one feather
 Bed and furniture which she at present lies on one Brass warming
 Pan one Black Cow and hide Heifer my Will and Desire is that
 all the Rest of my Estate Real & Personal shall be Equally Divided
 Among all my Children
 I nominate and appoint James Collins and my son
 Thomas Hittley Executors of this Will hereby Revoking
 and
