None of whereupon on the Motion of Margaret Widow & Heir of the
said Decedent Certificate is granted her for Obtaining Letters of
Administration with the Will annexed of the said Decedent's
Estate she having sworn to the same & given Bond and Security

Bed & furniture her choice, one Chest, two Pots, two Dishes half a Dozen
Plates two Basins, one Pair of Piggins, two Cows & Goats is her choice —
half a Dozen Sheep one Mare known by the Name of Pleasure & her
Saddle, half a Dozen Chairs, & the Reels of the Lands & Plantations —
whereon John Mcartie & John Forister now live during her life &
after her Decease the Land whereon John Mcartie lives to fall to
my Son William Hirtley & the Land whereon John Forister now
lives to fall to my son James Hirtley to them and their heirs forever
& the Remains to be sold to the highest Bidder & the Money to be
Equally Divided among my Children but, William Hirtley, Thomas
Hirtley, Francis Hirtley & James Hirtley, Sarah Cowhard and Mary
Collins —

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Hirtley the Cott of Land
whereon John Mcartie now lives lying below Farnows Run to him
& his heirs forever —

Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Hirtley one hundred &
Eight Acres of Land joining the Corner of John Delaney & Joseph
Dobson from thence to the Mouth of Earths Run lying on the South
Side of Stanton River joining Stanton line & one Bed of furniture
his choice after my wife's choice —

Item I give & bequeath to my son Francis Hirtley one Tract of Land
lying on the Blue Ridge on the head of the South River in Orange
County likewise twelve Acres of Land in Augusta County to him
and his heirs forever —

Item I give and bequeath unto my son James Hirtley all the Purchase
of the Tract of Land whereon I live together with two hundred
Acres of Land that I bought of George Stone, One Negro Boy
Named George & one Negro Girl Named Nancy to him & his heirs forever
Item, I give & bequeath to my Daughter Mary Collins three hundred
& Ten Acres of Land lying on the Branches of Cow way joining boundaries
kind to her and her heirs forever —

Item, It is my Desire that Jonathan Cowhard shall keep the Plant
& Land whereon he now lives & Quirely Pops the same till the year

One —

210 One Thousand seven hundred & Sixty Eight for the Rent of his
Plantation at Swift Run Gap which Rent is to be paid to James
Kirtley
I hereby leave all the Remainder of my Estate Land Negroes,
Goods & Chattels to be sold to the Highest Bidder at Twelve Months
Credit and the Money thereby arising to discharge all my Just
Debts & the Remainder to be Equally divided among my Dear Wife
& Children before named

Lastly I constitute & appoint my Beloved Wife Margaret Kirtley
William Kirtley, Thomas Kirtley, Francis Kirtley & James Kirtley
Executors of this my Last Will and Testament In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 22nd Day of
November 1762

According to Law the other Executors in the said Will mentioned
came into Court and refused to take the Oath of the Execution
thereof
